We create affordable housing by identifying vacant properties, preventing misuse, and promoting innovative living models.

Municipal housing is allocated transparently and fairly through a points-based system.

When it comes to construction, sustainability is the guiding principle: renovation before new builds, energy-efficient standards, climate-friendly methods, and grey-water cisterns and solar panels in development plans.

We protect green spaces and flowering meadows, reduce sealed surfaces, and implement a façade-greening strategy that improves the microclimate and provides habitat for plants and animals.

These steps will strengthen resilience to extreme weather events and their impacts.
